

School Self-Review

West Park School follows a programme of self-review and documents how the National Education Goals are being implemented.

Guidelines and Procedures

At West Park School:

- “Self Review is the way the Board identifies, assesses and evaluates the effectiveness of the school in meeting the values it has adopted, fulfilling its obligations to the community and providing the education it wants for its students”.
Self Review in Schools, National Education Reports, No. 3 1994.
- The plan for School Self Review is guided by the school’s strategic plan and any national and local expectations.
- Additional input into the school’s self review should come from performance appraisal findings and previous school self reviews.
- The School Self Review aims to ensure that all the National Education Guidelines are implemented effectively in all areas of the school.
- Two National Education Guidelines are reviewed each year.
- A survey is sent to the school community every 2 years to enable the school to assess the level of satisfaction in areas of the school’s operation.
- Any analysed version of the school’s Self Review Findings are published annually.
- Information gathered from the School Self Review supplemented by additional material form the basis of the school’s Annual Strategic & Development Plan.
- The general goals of the school Charter are included in the review process.
- The National Education Goals are implemented through the School’s Charter, curriculum and management systems.
